Outreach and Open Days

During 2017-18, the College was involved in 108 outreach events, involving students who attend more than 170 different schools and colleges. We also took part in the University Open Days with over 2,300 prospective applicants visiting the College. Under the University's 'Link Colleges' scheme, we particularly focus on working with schools in the London boroughs of Southwark and Hillingdon, and the North East, including Newcastle, Sunderland, Northumberland, Gateshead and North and South Tyneside.

To coincide with the University of Oxford Open Days, St Anne's College invited students from schools in the North East to take part in a residential visit to Oxford between 26 and 28 June. St Anne's transported 38 sixth formers, from 24 different state schools and colleges across Tyne and Wear and Northumberland to the College, providing free accommodation and meals throughout their stay. The deadline for applications was Monday 15 October and we hope that lots of those we're engaged with will have applied.

New MSt attached to OCCT launched

The University of Oxford has launched a new Masters degree attached to the [Comparative Criticism and Translation research centre \(OCCT\)](#) which is based in St Anne's. The MSt in Comparative Literature and Critical Translation, led by St Anne's fellow Professor Matthew Reynolds, is a nine-month, interdisciplinary course designed to give students critical, theoretical and research expertise in the intersecting fields of comparative and world literature and translation studies.
