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OUR AIMS

St Anne's College aims to be the home of choice for the brightest and most ambitious students from all backgrounds. Working with our link regions of **Hillingdon and Southwark** in London, and the **North East of England**, we aim to encourage and support all students - particularly those from backgrounds currently under-represented at Oxford - to make competitive applications to the University.

As part of our commitment to widening access to the University of Oxford, we prioritise running activities with state schools in our link regions. We also encourage our schools to bring groups where at least 50% of attendees are on Free Schools Meals or First Generation to Higher Education.

VISIT TO OXFORD

A typical Key Stage 2/3 visit may involve:

- Welcome and Higher Education Explained Talk from the Outreach Officer
- Tours of the college from Student Ambassadors
- Q&A with Student Ambassadors
- Carousel of short academic taster sessions delivered by students, tutors and outreach staff **OR**
- Guided museum visit and activity
- Refreshments and a sandwich lunch in college
- Evaluation activity

In Oxford - c.4 hours duration

We can develop bespoke visits if you would like to focus on a particular subject area, or if you would like sessions working on particular skills, such as oracy.

WHY UNIVERSITY, WHY OXFORD

In this session we aim to:

- Find out more about competitive universities and what they are looking for in applicants
- Learn more about studying and being a student at the University of Oxford
- Understand the costs associated with university
- Find out more about university courses and specific subjects required to study them
- Explore super-curricular activities to prepare for university study

Recommended for Year 10-11, 1 hour Online or in school



KEY STAGE 3 AND 4



OXPLORE WORKSHOP

This super-curricular workshop introduces a question from the <u>Oxplore website</u> and provides resources for students to either have a **classroom debate** facilitated by the Outreach Officer, **or** to **produce their own Oxplore question**.

Skills include: exploring a new topic critically, creating an evidence-based argument, developing verbal confidence, making links with curriculum subjects, and thinking outside of the classroom.

VISIT TO OXFORD: DISCOVERY DAY

A typical Key Stage 3/4 visit may involve:

- Welcome and Oxford Explained Talk from the Outreach Officer
- Tours of the college from Student Ambassadors
- Q&A with Student Ambassadors
- Carousel of short academic taster sessions delivered by students, tutors and outreach staff **OR**
- Guided museum visit and activity
- Refreshments and a sandwich lunch in college
- Evaluation activity

In Oxford - c.4 hours duration

We are happy to develop visit days to focus on specific subject areas (involving visits to departments) or on particular skills (such as making presentations or debating). We can work with students in school ahead of the visit to develop skills.



KEY STAGE 5

MAKING A COMPETITIVE APPLICATION

In this session we aim to:

- Consider what competitive universities are looking for in applicants
- Find out more about being a student at Oxford
- Understand the costs associated with university
- Consider courses on offer at Oxford
- Learn more about the Oxbridge application process and its admission stages
- Consider ways of exploring subjects outside of the classroom

- Link super-curricular activities with competitive university applications
- Explore the range of activities that can be super-curricular
- Gain confidence in finding relevant supercurricular activities

Suitable for Year 11-12, 1 hour Online or in school





PERSONAL STATEMENT WORKSHOP

In this session we aim to:

- Understand the Oxbridge application process
- Explore what competitive universities value in a personal statement
- Reflect on students' interest in their subject and their super-curricular activities
- Clarify top tips for writing a personal statement
- Examine some case studies

Recommended for Year 12-13, 1 hour presentation, or 90 mins as a workshop, developing students' statements Online or in school

ADMISSIONS TEST WORKSHOP

In this session we aim to:

- Understand the Oxbridge admissions process
- Clarify how Admissions Tests are used in the application process
- Explore ways of preparing for different admissions tests
- Examine how to approach particular past paper questions and gain confidence answering them
- Know where to go for more resources

Suitable for Year 12-13, 1 hour Online or in school





INTERVIEW SKILLS WORKSHOP

In this session we aim to:

- Clarify the Oxbridge admissions process, how interviews are used, and what to expect
- Explore past interview questions and approaches to answering them
- Gain confidence and skills in answering unseen interview questions
- Understand further ways of preparing for interviews

Recommended for Year 13, 60-90mins Online or in school

VISIT TO OXFORD: TASTER DAY

A typical Key Stage 5 visit may involve:

- Welcome and Competitive Applications Talk from the Outreach Officer
- Tour of the college from Student Ambassadors
- Q&A with Student Ambassadors
- Choice of academic taster sessions with Oxford staff (depending on availability)
- Refreshments and a sandwich lunch in college
- Second college tour
- Evaluation activity

TEACHERS

These workshops can cover a range of topics, depending on your needs, and may be particularly suitable for Heads of Year, Sixth Form Staff, Sixth Form tutors and subject champions.

Content can include:

- Overview of the Oxbridge application process
- Writing competitive personal statements
- Writing school references
- Preparing for admissions tests
- Interview skills and preparation
- Supporting Oxbridge applicants
- Gaining feedback for applicants

We are keen to work with teachers across schools, where possible - a group from a MAT or local schools. If you are interested in joining with other schools to work on programmes for more able students, please let us know.

ARRANGING WORKSHOPS

Where possible and, depending on availability, we would strongly recommend booking a programme of events for your students across the school year:

e.g. Year 12 Competitive Applications in the spring term, Year 12 Personal Statements in June, Year 13 Admissions Tests in July/September, Interview Skills in October/November.

We also strongly encourage teachers to bring at least 50% of participants from Widening Participation backgrounds e.g. FSM, First Generation to university etc. on visits to the University of Oxford.

We can be flexible around the school day in arranging sessions with you.

AIM FOR OXFORD (NORTH EAST)

Aim for Oxford is our sustained contact programme for Year 12 students from state schools in the North East of England, run jointly with Christ Church and Trinity Colleges.

After being selected for the programme, participants will:

- Explore subjects with university researchers through academic taster sessions
- Attend workshops on the application stages
- Be invited to attend a free week-long residential in Oxford
- Receive ongoing support from current students and outreach staff through Year 13 and university applications.
