## Discussion Points

- What is “global governance”? How does it differ from national or local government?
- Why might AI be particularly difficult to regulate?
- Who should be responsible for governing AI: governments, international bodies, private companies, or users?
- What are some risks of AI systems that cross borders (e.g. facial recognition, autonomous weapons, misinformation bots)?
- Can you think of any current examples where AI is already shaping international politics or diplomacy?
- Should AI be treated as a tool, a collaborator, or something else entirely?

## Have You Considered...?

- Researching how the EU or UN are currently approaching AI regulation?
- Exploring the role of large tech companies (e.g. Google, OpenAI, Meta) in shaping global AI norms?
- Thinking about how inequality or power imbalances affect who benefits from AI?
- Asking how cultural values influence attitudes toward AI (e.g., in China vs. the UK)?
- Considering the impact of AI on the climate: from energy use to modelling climate change?
- Writing a short policy proposal: “How should the UK regulate AI in the next ten years?”
