- Can you think of any current examples where AI is already shaping international politics or diplomacy?
- Should AI be treated as a tool, a collaborator, or something else entirely?

- Researching how the EU or UN are currently approaching AI regulation?
- Exploring the role of large tech companies (e.g. Google, OpenAl, Meta) in shaping global Al norms?
- Thinking about how inequality or power imbalances affect who benefits from AI?
- Asking how cultural values influence attitudes toward AI (e.g., in China vs. the UK)?
- Considering the impact of AI on the climate: from energy use to modelling climate change?
- Writing a short policy proposal: "How should the UK regulate AI in the next ten years?"
