You may also speak with your study abroad office about submitting an independent application. Your US home institution does not need to have a partnership with St Anne's College, Arcadia or IFSA for you to apply.

If you are applying from China you could consider applying through [UniHive Education](#), the [Oxford Prospects Programme](#), or you can apply as an independent applicant. Your home institution does not need to have a partnership with St Anne's College, UniHive or OPP for you to apply.

If you are applying from any other country you are welcome to submit an independent application. Each year we welcome students from global institutions to the programme. Your home institution does not need to have a partnership with St Anne's College for you to apply.

All applicants are required to

- be studying towards an accredited degree
- be in good academic and financial standing at their home institution
- have the permission of their study abroad or academic adviser at their home institution

Postgraduate students can apply to the Visiting Students Programme but will follow Oxford's undergraduate curriculum.
