

Studying joint subjects as a Visiting Student

If you apply for the Extended Academic Year, Academic Year or Hilary and Trinity terms you may be interested in studying joint subjects. If you are applying for the Fall Term we recommend you focus on one subject for your Michaelmas study and can combine this with a course from another subject in September.

In order to study joint subjects a visiting student needs to be studying both subjects at their home institution already. With the exception of PPE (see below) you can apply to study a maximum of two subjects as a visiting student at St Anne's.

The following subjects are offered as joint degrees at Oxford, which means they are generally more easily undertaken by visiting students who have a background in both subjects –

- Classics and English
- Classics and Modern Languages
- Classics and Asian and Middle Eastern Studies
- Computer Science and Mathematics
- Computer Science and Philosophy
- English and Modern Languages
- History and Economics
- History and Modern Languages
- History and Politics
- Mathematics and Philosophy
- Philosophy and Modern Languages
- Philosophy, Politics and Economics (PPE)
 - if applying for the extended academic year or academic year visiting students can apply to study all three subjects
 - If applying for the Fall Term or Hilary and Trinity terms it is possible to apply for two of the three subjects

The following sciences can be studied jointly:

- biochemistry and biomedical sciences if applying for our pre-medical programme
 - Extended academic year, academic year and Fall term
- computer science and mathematics
 - Extended academic year, academic year, Fall term, Hilary and Trinity terms
- experimental psychology and maths
 - Extended academic year, academic year, Fall term, Hilary and Trinity terms

It is possible to combine other subjects taught in humanities or social sciences, and to sometimes combine a science subject with a humanities or social science subject not already listed above. Please email Visiting.Students@st-annes.ox.ac.uk with your query prior to application.

Application form information

If you wish to apply for two (joint) subjects, please indicate both subjects in all applicable places on your application form. Please ensure you list courses from both subjects on your application form and in your preference order ie. do not make separate subject lists, integrate all courses into one list in your preference order.

Please also read the application guidance notes carefully regarding the submission of academic work and references when applying for joint subjects.

When applying for joint subjects it is possible you may only be offered a place to study one subject, rather than both, if you are not deemed to have sufficient background in both subjects.
